What you need to know

Do you offer scholarships?

We offer generous scholarships of up to £2,000 per year to help with the cost of study.

How long will I study for?

Foundation 1 year • Bachelors 3 years • Masters 1 year-18 months
Integrated Undergraduate Masters 4 years.

Where is the University of South Wales?

South Wales, UK with campuses in Cardiff, Newport and Pontypridd. Wales is a country in its own right, but is part of the UK. We have an international airport at Cardiff, but can also be reached from London in around 2 and a half hours. South Wales is a friendly, safe and inexpensive place to live.

When do courses start?

September (undergraduate and postgraduate) and February (mainly postgraduate).

Entry requirements?

For Foundation entry: Students who have a 60% pass in their Secondary School Leaving Certificate and an IELTS of 5.0 or above can be considered for entry onto our International Foundation Year.

For undergraduate entry: Students who have completed a recognised foundation year or higher education diploma can be considered for admission to first degree programmes.

For undergraduate advanced entry: Applicants who hold a 4 year (Hons) degree or a 3 year Bachelor (pass) degree from Libya will be considered. All advanced entry applications will be considered on an individual basis.

For postgraduate entry: Applicants with a good honours Bachelor degree will be considered for postgraduate Masters degree courses.

What about English?

For International Foundation Programme: UKVI IELTS at least 5.0 overall.

For undergraduate courses: IELTS 6.0, IGCSE English Language C.

For postgraduate courses: IELTS 6.5, IGCSE English Language C.
