

# What you need to know

## Where is the University of South Wales?

The University is based in South Wales, UK with campuses in Cardiff, Newport and Pontypridd. Wales is a country in its own right, but is part of the UK. Cardiff airport is around 35 minutes away, Bristol airport is just over an hour away and London Heathrow can be reached in around 2 and a half hours. Wales is a friendly, safe and inexpensive place to live.

## Where will I live?

There are many options available to you. You may wish to stay in University owned halls of residence, privately owned halls of residence or private accommodation. ## Academic Entry Requirements

For undergraduate entry:

- Apolytirion with Panhellenics: 16 or above
- Apolytirion without Panhellenics: 18 or above.
- Network Foundation programme with 50% or above **and** either the Apolytirion with Panhellenics (14 or above) or the Apolytirion without Panhellenics (16 or above)
- IB and A levels will also be considered.

Note: Some programmes may require higher grades, or that you have studied specific subjects.

Students who do not meet these entry requirements will be considered for a foundation year.

For postgraduate entry:

Holders of the Ptychion from an AEI or a TEI with a grade of 6.5 or a second class Degree or above will be considered for postgraduate courses.

## English Entry Requirements

- IELTS with 6.0 or above (and 5.5 in each band)
- IGCSE English with a C grade or above
- Cambridge English: Advanced (CAE) with C grade or above/B2

## How much money will I spend?

We estimate that between £145 and £166 should cover your weekly living costs (including accommodation).



## How much will my course cost?\*

Undergraduate courses:

We are awaiting confirmation of tuition fees for 2018/19 however it's expected that tuition fees will be £9,000. EU students are also eligible for the Tuition Fee Loan meaning that you pay nothing until after you have completed your studies.

This funding will be **guaranteed for the duration of study** if students continue to satisfy all eligibility requirements.

Postgraduate courses:

Tuition fees for 2018/19 will be £9,000†. The University will provide a fee discount of £3,000, which means you will pay £6,000. You can also apply for a loan worth up to £13,000 to cover your tuition fees and living costs.

## Are there scholarships available?\*\*\*

Undergraduate courses:

Students with a score of 18 or above in the Apolytirion, can apply for the Academic Achievement Scholarship (worth £2,000 in the first year of the course).

Postgraduate courses:

Students with a score of 7.5 or above in a Ptychion from an AEI may apply for our Postgraduate Scholarship worth up to £2,000.
